

PCDHFC PPC Report for AGM

Precision Pistol Competition (PPC) works closely with LEAP to provide club members with competitive and training opportunities in PPC. PPC is an accuracy based pistol discipline which has its origins in police training, welcoming Law Enforcement, civilian and military participants; who are holster qualified. In competition a specific number of rounds are fired, from specified distances, within time frames at a standard target, creating scores that are easily compared to previous scores, to track improvement and compare to scores fired by other competitors around the world. Both pistols and revolvers are used and calibers 9mm and above are required.

We offer matches at PCDHFC 12 times per year, usually the second Saturday of the month during the LEAP shoots, on Range 3. We also offer a practice session on the third Sunday of each month, on Range 3. From May 1st to Thanksgiving we also hold practice session on Range 1, each Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

Practice sessions are designed to meet the needs of all participants, who are participating to improve their pistol shooting skills as they relate to PPC, by volunteer coaches. The fees cover the cost of targets, \$5 per practice session.

Sessions are provided by PCDHFC Board Member Mark Horsley and Designates Gordon Tremblay and Ken Fisher. Mark is a 2019 world PPC Champion as a member of the Canadian two member revolver team, bronze medalists in 2023. Gordon and Ken are experienced competitors and qualified PPC coaches.
